Here is your opportunity to ski for 4 days straight, what better way to bring in the 2024 new year. On Friday December 29, 2023, a group of adventurous X-C skiers will begin their intrepid journey on a Lamers Bus. You can be one of them, yes you!

Here is your opportunity to experience the beauty of Vermont in winter. The trip will consist of eight days and seven nights, with opportunity to ski on six days.

We plan to stay at the Comfort Inn Trolley Square near Rutland see here. The rooms include TV, refrigerator, microwave, etc. The hotel has a pool and there is a restaurant next door.

Club Dues Must Be Paid Before Going on Ski Trips

Several Nordic Ski Club of Milwaukee members have not renewed their memberships by paying club dues. To get the membership price for our bus ski trips, you must pay your dues before the trips start. Our low dues of \$25 per individual or \$35 per couple is a bargain given that we offer free food at member meetings. Our October 13, 2023, meeting featured pizza, veggies and sweets.

It's not just about the money. We count on your renewals to update us on your contact information. If we can't contact you, we can't tell you about trips, hikes, campouts, etc. We also need you to agree to our liability waiver every year, which is part of your renewal and keeps our insurance up to date. Finally, we need a certain number of members just to hold our ski trips and to keep club activities going.

We have four bus ski trips up north planned this season plus a plane trip to Vermont. We have several member meetings scheduled (see coming events article) plus outings and events year-round.

Intricacies of the Ice Age Trail

At least eight members of the Nordic Ski Club of Milwaukee have traversed the thousand-plus miles of Wisconsin's famous Ice Age Trail. Two of them gave slide presentations at the club's Oct. 13, 2023, member meeting. Jane Stoltz completed the trail in 2009. "Things have improved since then," she noted. "There are a lot more boardwalks than when I hiked."

Fred Paasch also showed slides from his trek on the trail, which included both walking and bicycling. His pictures featured amusing hazards such as tilted boardwalks, creeks with no bridges and slippery stones, and confusing signs with arrows pointing in opposite directions. Then there was a photo of him wearing a hat with netting, long sleeves and gaiters--all to protect from insects such as flies and ticks. "I would not hike in the summer again," he said. "Most of my hiking was in spring or early fall."

Nordic Ski Club President Carol Doebler, who has done parts of the trail on and off for years, said she preferred the trail in winter. "No ticks." She added: "The Ice Age Trail is one of the top trails in the nation." All speakers agreed the trail has lots of beautiful scenery and many places to stay along the route.

The speakers noted that there are Ice Age Trail chapters in areas along the trail who help maintain it. Sometimes chapter members will help you shuttle from place to place. They're called Trail Angels. There can be long distances of road that you have to walk between trailheads, which can be boring.

Jane noted: "I didn't really enjoy the road miles until a friend told me to look up." Ah, the sky. Fred said he biked many of the road miles and also biked the Sugar River Trail and the Gandydancer Trail. So, technically, he's not a member of the Ice Age Trail's Thousand-Miler Club. You're supposed to traverse the trail on foot: walking, snowshoeing or skiing. Nordic Ski Club members or past members who are Thousand Milers (and the dates they completed the

trail) are: Kathy Clavette (6-1-06), Anne Riendl (6-1-06), Craig Sanford (8-25-06), Jane Stoltz (4-24-09), Betty Schraith (10-4-14), Barbara Johnson (10-25-16) and Lois Gresl (4-11-23).

Help Plan a Fish Fry

Got a favorite fish fry place? Share it. Volunteer to organize the Nordic Ski Club of Milwaukee's annual February Fish Fry. It takes very little effort. You just need to find a place that can accommodate 20 to 25 club members in one area for a Friday fish fry on February 16, 2024.

We'll help you write an article on the event for our February newsletter and also arrange for people to sign up ahead of time. Meanwhile, for leading/organizing an event, your name will be put in our April volunteer drawing. Twice a year (April and October), the club draws names from the group of club members who have led club events or volunteered for the club in the previous six months. Two winners get \$50 each. (If you can't find anything for February 16, the alternate date would be February 23.)

Covid and Bus Trips - When to Cancel

Covid-19 and other respiratory viruses are still a concern for Nordic Ski Club of Milwaukee bus ski trips. Many ski-club members are in the older age group that is more likely to have serious symptoms if they get a respiratory infection such as Covid-19, RSV, the flu, whooping cough or even a cold.

That's why the club requires that participants who get sick in the days before a ski trip or on the day of the trip to cancel. You will be refunded all recoverable costs of bus trips with a maximum loss of \$60. Please do not expose other trip participants to contagious diseases. You don't want to be responsible for sending someone to the hospital or to days (or weeks) of serious illness.

While NSCM does not require that members get the new Covid-19 booster, we strongly recommend it. Most of our members indicated in 2022 that they were vaccinated against Covid-19, and the NSCM board voted in June 2023 to no longer require Covid vaccinations for our bus trips. We have not surveyed members to see how many have gotten the 2023 boosters. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control recommends Covid boosters as well as flu shots. And you may want to consider vaccinating for RSV, a virus that is showing up in seniors.

The Nordic Ski Club of Milwaukee (NSCM) continues to follow recommendations by the Centers for Disease Control and Wisconsin authorities regarding Covid-19 safety. Know that your participation in any event is at your own risk. Before attending any NSCM outing or event, please check with the event leader. Use good judgment and continue to keep us all safe.
