Fish Fry and Meeting

Friday, February 16, 2024, 5:30 pm

Welcome a new year with the Nordic Ski Club of Milwaukee’s annual fish fry dinner and meeting. It will be held on the south side of Milwaukee County at the **Open Flame** restaurant in Hales Corners, 5081 S. 108th Street (at the corner of Hwy 100 and Edgerton). We have their back “sun porch” room, which seats up to 30 people.

We can order off the menu. So if you really don’t want fish or are vegetarian, you can order something else. Since lack of snow caused the club to cancel two ski trips, this will be a good chance to get together with friends or make new ones.

Fish Fry options include:

- 12 oz. beer-battered Icelandic cod or 12 oz. beer-battered lake perch with potato pancakes, roasted corn and homemade coleslaw for \$14.99
- Baked Icelandic cod Oscar, topped with real crab meat, scallops, shrimp, asparagus, and Hollandaise sauce, served with choice of potato for \$18.99
- 10-12 oz. baked Icelandic cod served with lemon cream sauce, broccoli spears with a side of Hollandaise sauce, and choice of potato for \$16.99

All beverages, desserts, etc. are additional, and there is a required tip amount.

Minocqua Ski Trip

Friday, February 9 - Sunday, February 11, 2024

There is still plenty of room on the bus, but only a limited number of rooms at the motel, so if you want to go on the trip, you need to call or e-mail the trip leader as soon as possible.

We'll be skiing at Minocqua Winter Park, which was named the No. 1 Cross Country Ski Resort in the country by USA Today, and has 86 km of meticulously groomed ski trails and 15 miles of snowshoe trails. A café in the chalet serves a variety of food, and homemade soups. The ski shop, has all the latest ski gear, waxes, and clothes; and rents skis and snowshoes.

We plan to ski at Nine Mile Forest near Wausau on the way up, with 30 km of ski trails, 11 km of snowshoe trails, and a large chalet with ski rentals.

Accommodations are at the AmericInn in downtown Minocqua with a swimming pool, sauna, whirlpool, free continental breakfast, and a microwave and refrigerator in each room. Bring or rent snowshoes to enjoy 16 km of the most diverse and scenic snowshoeing you'll find in the Midwest. We'll stop at Nine Mile Forest near Wausau on our way up to ABR. Nine Mile Forest has 30 km of both skating and striding ski trails and 11 km of snowshoe trails. The chalet offers ski rentals.

We'll stay at the Quality Inn hotel in Ironwood. Some restaurants are within walking distance of the hotel, and there are more dining options in nearby downtown Hurley. Saturday's group dinner will be at the Elk & Hound Restaurant on the Gogebic Country Club grounds in Ironwood. Expect an unforgettable evening!

2023, meeting. In the past, we allowed non-members to participate in trips at a higher price. Since our current membership fee is low -- \$25 for individuals -- it makes sense for trip participants simply to join the club instead of paying a higher trip price. And one set of pricing makes it easier for trip leaders. Also, please make sure you have paid your dues, and signed the club's liability waiver, before you go on a trip or you won't be allowed on the trip.

Club Members: Have Your Own Insurance

Insurance companies throughout the U.S. have been raising prices of premiums. The Nordic Ski Club of Milwaukee (NSCM) got a notice recently that our premium for liability insurance was being raised by more than four times our annual rate. And it was being raised in the middle of our contract year. After time-consuming research, the board made a decision. The extra premium cost was due in December. At its December 11, 2023, board meeting, the NSCM board of directors voted to cancel our insurance.

This is a reminder and a notice that NSCM members should always have your own health coverage as well as liability insurance provided through your homeowners or renter's insurance. Having an additional umbrella insurance policy provides even more coverage. NSCM's liability insurance had provided very little protection and specifically did not provide liability coverage for snow-related activities. The board decided that the huge expense for limited coverage was not worth depleting our assets.

Board Elections Held in March With Email Ballot

Are you interested in promoting the future of cross-country skiing? Then volunteer on the Nordic Ski Club of Milwaukee (NSCM) board of directors. If you'd like to run for a board position, please contact President Carol Doebler by March 1, 2024 (see below). Holding elections online rather than in person started with the Covid 19 pandemic and has worked well.

They're easier and save time. So NSCM has made online elections permanent. The club will conduct our annual meeting and elections via email and a survey format. The simple process takes only minutes. We need your response to help us keep the club running. Please make sure you have paid annual dues before voting on these few items (plus any others submitted by March 1):

- approving the minutes of the March 25, 2023, annual meeting
- voting in four board members who are re-running for two-year terms*
- voting to adjourn

Balloting runs March 13 through 23, 2024. Look for announcements, recognitions of volunteers and other news in your email, just as there would be at an in-person annual meeting.

Nominations and Resolutions: Our bylaws allow us to take nominations for anyone who wants to run for the board, even though we have a full complement of volunteers willing to run. Some of those volunteers would be happy to give up their seat on the board if someone else comes forward to run. The only feasible way to do this is to have you email a nomination for the board by Friday, March 1, to President Carol Doebler.

For the nomination to be valid, you must get permission from the person you are nominating (or you can nominate yourself) and you must get another club member to second your nomination. Email these by March 1 [so we have time to get them on the ballot] to tortoiseski@wi.rr.com. To this same email address, you can send any resolutions to propose -- with the name of a club member who is seconding them.

The pattern continued for the Valley Spur bus trip to Hiawatha National Forest south of Munising, Michigan. Then our plane trip to Vermont was cancelled since there was little snow and rain predicted.

Then in January we got pummeled with snow in southeastern Wisconsin. Meanwhile, we're thankful for the machine-made snow at Lapham Peak State Forest, which was available even during the warm days of December 2023. Thank you to NSCM members who support the snowmaking effort.
